Research shows our Sector is significant!


Important comparative research has recently been completed and published by the Office for the Community and Voluntary Sector (administered by the Ministry of Social Development), in conjunction with Massey University and the John Hopkins University.

The research findings suggest that while the civil society sector of NZ is both significant and growing, it remains largely invisible in our country. This document is an eye opener!

The research data identifies that not only is the sector very diverse, but that 67% of our Not for Profit (NFP) organisation workforce consists of volunteers. This is significantly higher than found anywhere else. In Australia for example, it is only

40%. New Zealand volunteers work within and alongside widespread NFP organisations, involving cultural, sports and recreation, health education and social services, welfare and community support services, environmental protection and conservation, civic activism, unions and professional associations, and religious worship activities.

The NFP Sector currently contributes more than \$10 billion to the NZ economy in operation expenditure, employing approx 201,000 full time equivalent jobs, equating to 9.6% of the economically active population, and 4.9% of the GDP. The sector engages a workforce that is larger than the Construction and Transport industries combined, and is a similar size to

the Manufacturing sector of NZ, an economic presence worthy of recognition in New Zealand, in addition to their social and political importance.

These figures are significant. In fact, our society could not function without the services provided by NFP organisations.

And yet few if any would survive without volunteers.

Volunteering Auckland OPEN DAY

VA held an Open Day in September called "Getting to Know Volunteering Auckland", for new and existing member organisations as well as anyone interested in registering with us.

28 people from 24 organisations joined us for refreshments and finger food, the opportunity to put faces to names and actually ask questions face to face, discover where we actually are, find out what we actually do from enquiry to interview to database to volunteering fit, as well as have the opportunity to talk with personnel and view our library. The day was beneficial for member organisations because it heightened awareness of

the services we provide, and helped clarify what we need from you, enabling the process when filling out job descriptions for volunteers needed. The benefit for Volunteering Auckland was learning more about you and how best we can try and help meet your needs for volunteers.

Feedback received from the Open Day was really helpful for VA. Comments from visitors included mention that VA is a "social connection for volunteers", that we add value to existing networks and that we provide pathways for community groups to access support, filling needs for unfunded services.

The opportunity to network was well received, as was discovery of our resources and ideas, administrative assistance and support, education and training opportunities with regard to volunteering, how we go about locating corporate volunteer groups for annual events, and the ways we try to meet the varying needs of different organisations. The greatest response from attendees' feedback was "we want more, more, more" especially information, and training in the many areas of volunteering.

Research shows our Sector is significant continued

Our NFP organisations have to rely greatly on goodwill, a high level of volunteer engagement as well as ongoing philanthropic contributions, in order to survive. They receive 75% of their income from fees and philanthropy and only 25% from government support, comparatively low compared with other countries. The Australian government provides 32% of NFP organisation income.

Major demographic and workforce changes such as our aging population, increasing numbers of paid working parents, increased regulation, all impact on the ability of NFP organisations to engage and retain volunteer staff.

The time for the Not for Profit Sector of NZ to be recognised widely as an important contributor to the economy as a whole is long overdue, especially by the commercial sector groups of this country, as well as the government
